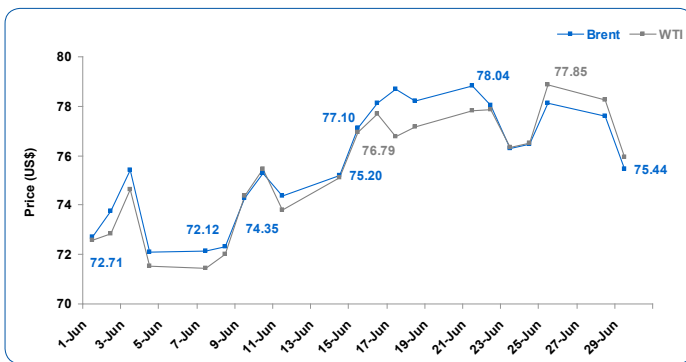
DGCX Volume Hits All Time Monthly High in June

- Volume reached a new monthly high in June of 192,138 contracts, surpassing the previous peak achieved in November 2009
- June also saw the highest ever monthly volume for Indian Rupee/Dollar futures at 12,159 contracts
- Trading activity in June was led by significant increases in volume across all product suites - precious metals, currencies and crude oil
- Month-on-month volume rose by 24% for gold, 95% for Euro/Dollar, 40% for INR and 187% for WTI futures

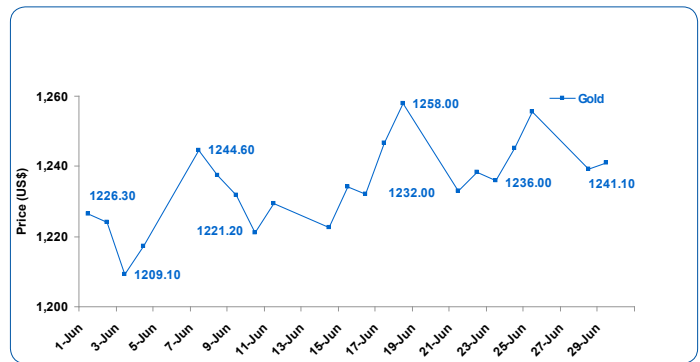

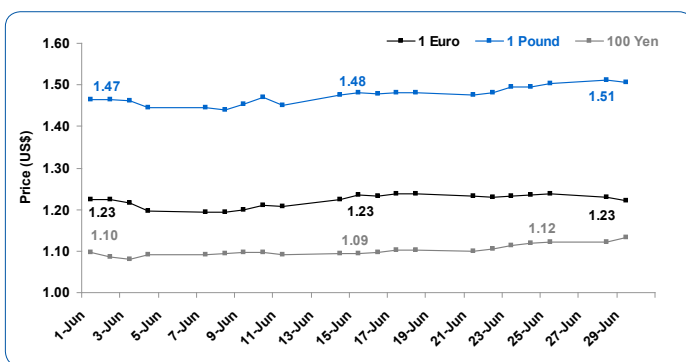
Energy Futures Settlement Prices



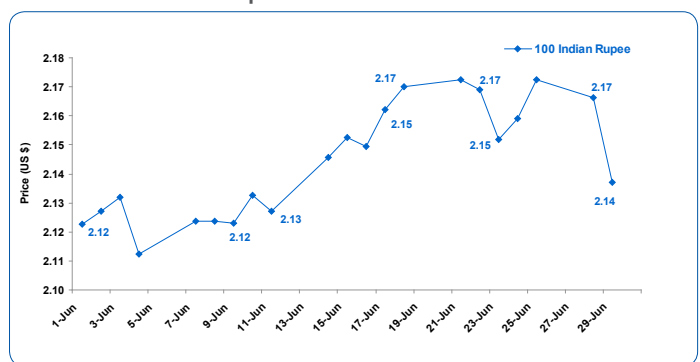
Gold Futures Settlement Prices



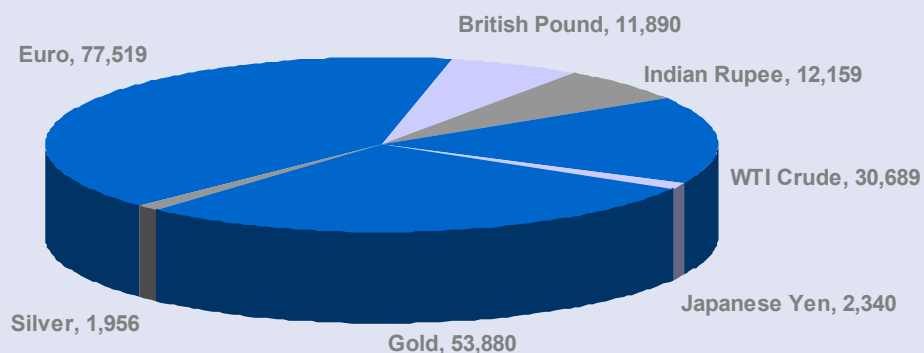
Euro, Pound, Yen Futures Settlement Prices

DGCX Indian Rupee Contract Achieves Record Day

- Indian Rupee/Dollar futures reached the highest ever daily volume of 1,264 contracts, valued at US \$53.8 million on July 1st, 2010
- A total of 16,277 contracts traded on July 1st, 2010, the second highest daily volume for the exchange since inception
- The new trading record for the Indian Rupee contract surpassed the previous peak of 1,074 contracts and US \$47.37 million notional value achieved on March 26th, 2010 and follows the highest ever Indian Rupee monthly volume which was set last month
- Year-to-date volume for Indian Rupee/Dollar futures is more than double the number of contracts traded in the same period last year, with growth of 121%
